

Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct

The Lefty Grove Baseball League is an instructional league intended to teach youth the love of baseball and the basic skills needed to play the game. Though there is competition, it is meant to be friendly. Good sportsmanship is expected on the part of all participants, coaches, and caregivers.

As parents/guardians, you bear the responsibility of being a positive role model for your children. By your example, you must demonstrate appropriate behavior and good sportsmanship. Your support of your child, as well as the other children playing in the league, will ensure another successful summer of baseball in the Lefty Grove League.

The Board of Directors requires adherence to the following:

1. All players and coaches should be supported and encouraged during the games. Jeering, taunting of coaches, players, or any inappropriate behavior, will not be tolerated.
2. Game umpires and scorekeepers are to be treated with consideration and kindness, especially during any disputes or disagreements. Many are youngsters who can be intimidated by negative comments from adults who should know better.
3. Spectators are to remain outside of the playing area, including dugouts. Parents can be distractions when they are too close to the field.

Parents or spectators who violate these expectations will be subject to removal from the Lefty Grove fields. The Lefty Grove League Board of Directors reserves the right to ban anyone who violates these expectations.
